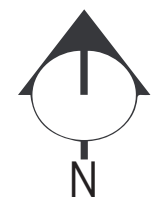


- ① PROPOSED ENTRANCE SIGN AND NATIVE PLANTING

EDIBLE NATIVES | PLANTING AREA

A large sandy area between the proposed motorized trail and the round pavilion will feature a selection of hardy edible plantings paired with interpretive rubbing plaques with titles in English and the Ojibwa language.

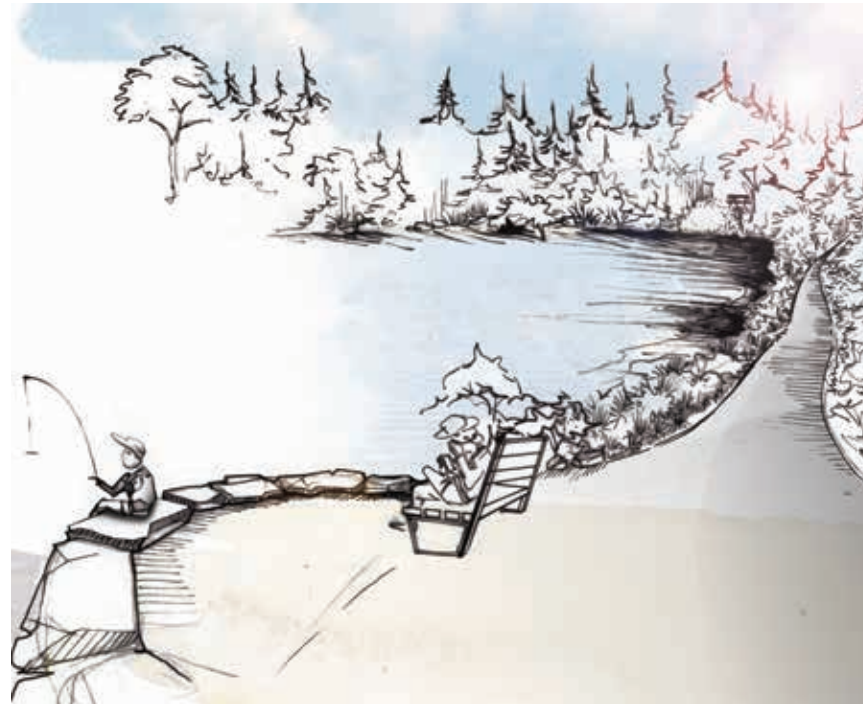

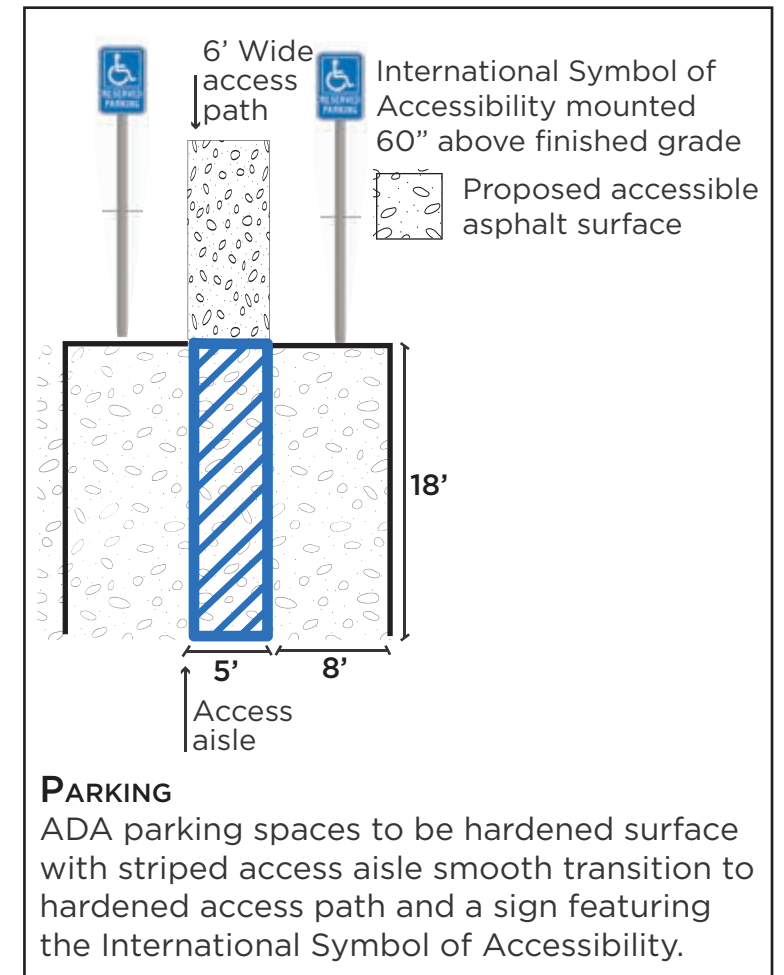

ACCESSIBLE FISHING AND VIEWING AREA



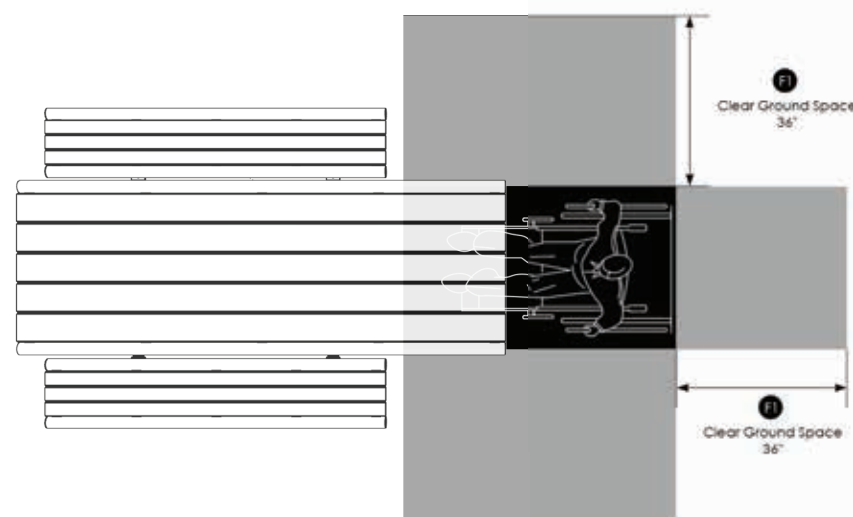
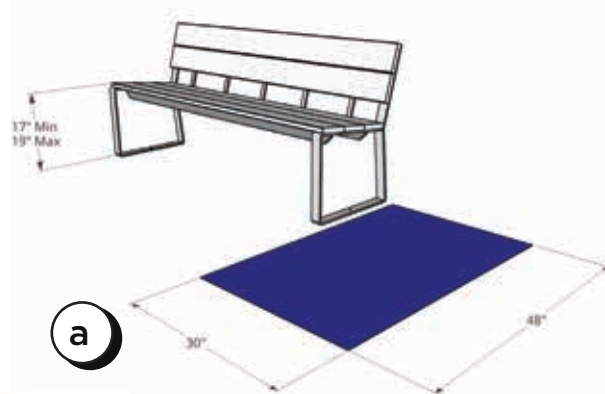
A space for people to fish and relax will be provided with a bump out along the edge of the accessible trail.

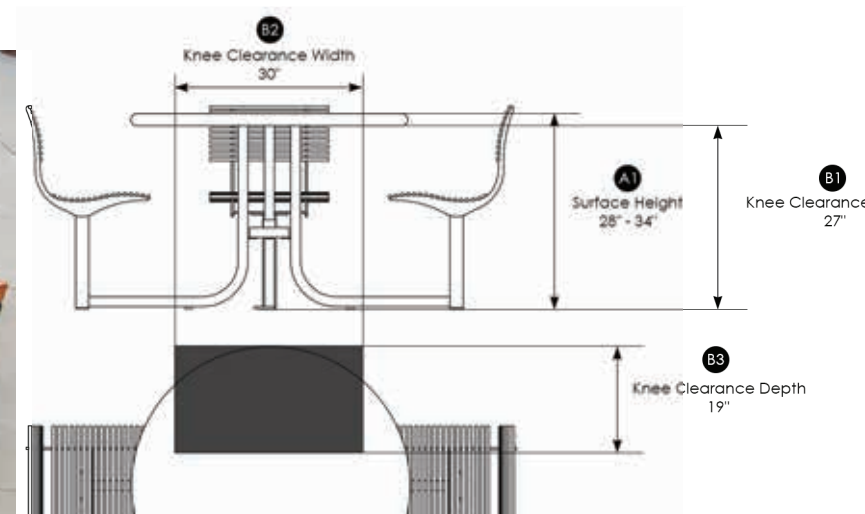


ACCESSIBLE PICNIC AND SEATING AREAS

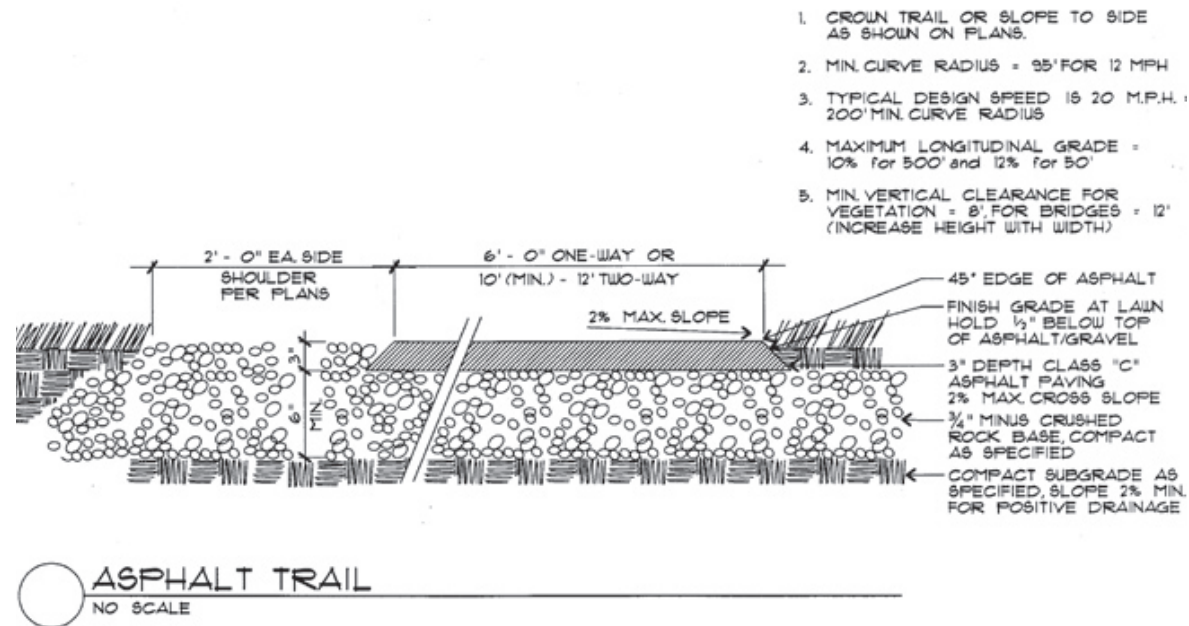

Trails

SEPARATION OF MOTORIZED AND NON-MOTORIZED USERS

An accessible asphalt trail will follow the west shore of the lake along the existing snowmobile trail. This smooth even grade provides the most feasible option for allowing access for all to the southern end of the lake.



MOTORIZED TRAIL

The existing snowmobile trail will be routed to the terrain above the nature trail on the eastern edge of the lake.

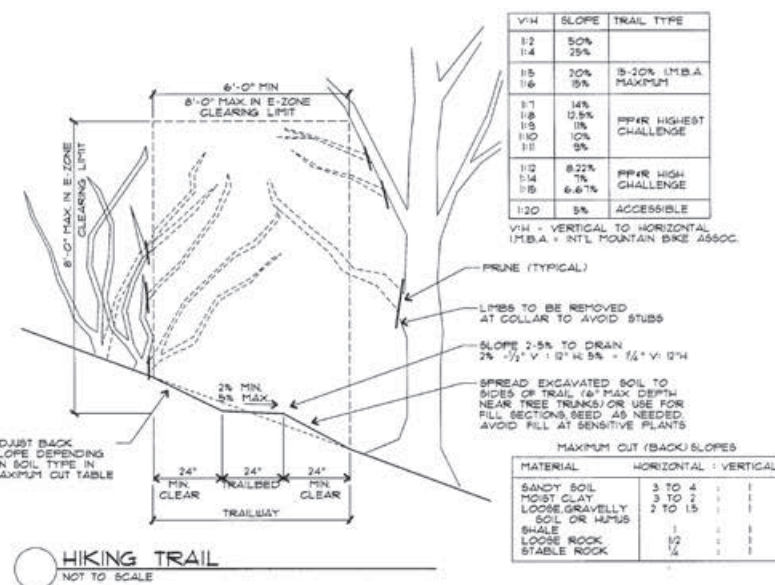
SIGNAGE

Proposed entrance sign and trail sign posts mounted along non-motorized trail sections noting natural elements within the landscape.



NATURE TRAIL

A 16" wide natural surface trail will follow the eastern edge of the lake affording users several framed views of the lake and the option to complete a loop around the lake. Potential future opportunity to double as a cross county ski/snowshoe trail.

Bike parking and water bottle filling/drinking fountain to be located in the day use area



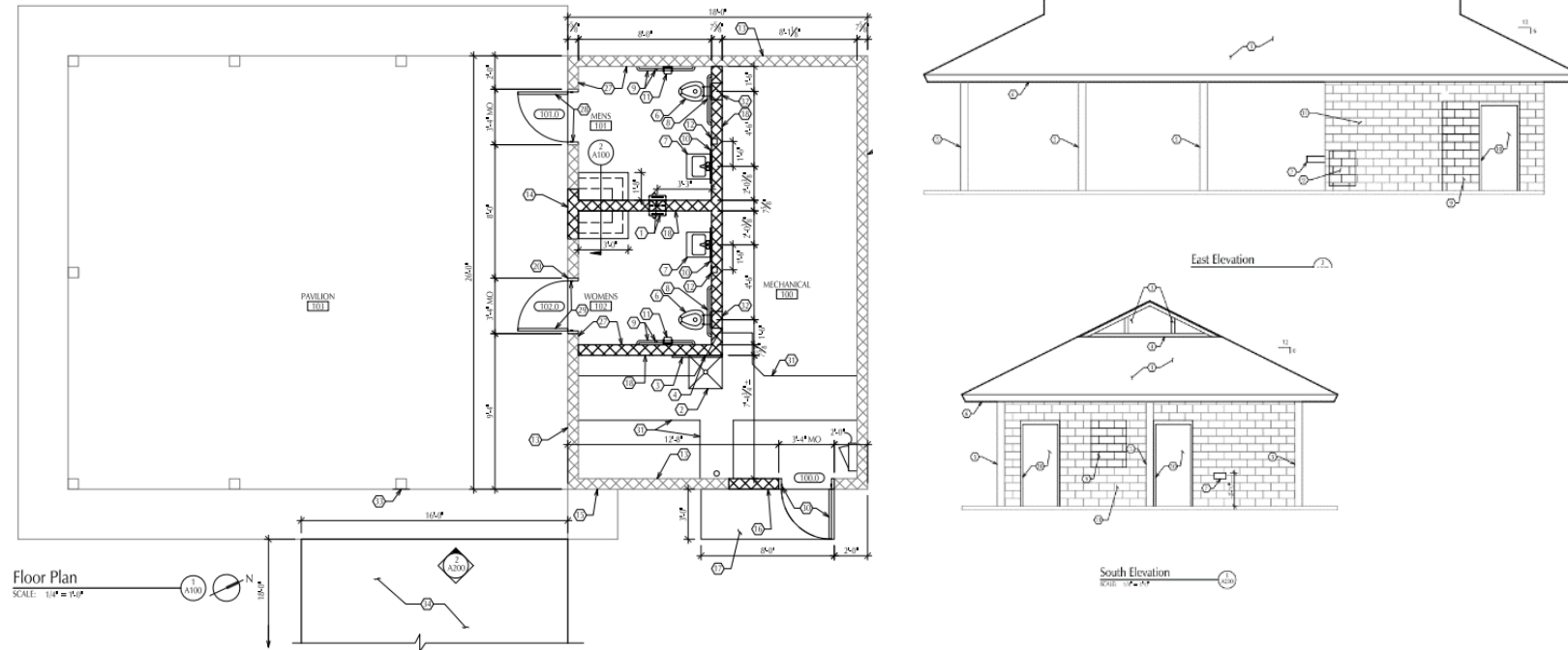
Community Gathering Spaces

WELLNESS HUB AREA

The existing shelter will be renovated converting a former concession area into a universally accessible wellness hub, an anchor space of the park, equipped with ADA restrooms and a display of regional trail and recreation information.

Adjacent to the Wellness Hub, infrastructure for food truck hook-ups will be installed and space for community events, like farmers markets, will be adorned with art and leisurely child activities like hopscotch and four square.

LAKE TOP PAVILION

The lake top pavilion will be renovated to host community events like music and group exercise in the park and other events. An ADA accessible path will connect the pavilion and the parking lot.

 Narrow nature trail to be located on eastern shore of the lake. Terrain is too steep to meet ADA access requirements.

 Convert to accessible asphalt trail with fishing/viewing platform and move motorized trail to opposite side of lake to avoid bisecting the day use area and to ensure there is a safe area for non-motorized trail users to recreate.
