

1. Planning

The Division provided assistance and guidance to County departments and supported local and regional community planning efforts

The Marquette County 2040 Master Plan, grounded in extensive community input, directs the Division's activities. It outlines 10 goals and 100 strategies, offering a broad range of activities and topics for community engagement and development.













Activities

Airport Zoning Ordinance Administration: Reviewed projects and staffed Airport Zoning Board of Appeals

Planning Commission: Attended regular meetings, reviewed and prepared reports on 17 zoning ordinance and plan amendments

Capital Improvements Planning: Administered call for projects, scored 23 project requests totaling \$31.4 million and prepared information for County Administration

Marquette Sawyer Regional Airport Signage: Prepared and implemented a directional signage plan to reduce confusion and establish consistency in the vicinity of the airport, replacing 15 signs

K.I. Sawyer Operations: Responded to map and data requests, assisted in golf course planning and initiation of ALP removal

Climate Action Plan (CAP): Staffed the CAP Subcommittee; hosted 12 community events, 3 employee events, stakeholder interviews; conducted 2 surveys; and drafted the plan

Facility Energy Audit: Secured and administered an EGLE Community Energy Management Grant (\$100K) to complete an ASHRAE Level 2 Energy Audit, greenhouse gas emissions inventory, and fleet review of five County facilities and obtained an additional \$22.4K SEMCO incentive

Materials Management Planning (MMP): Facilitated the County in the implementation of the updated Part 115 of NREPA; the CBOC accepted the role as County Approval Agency, worked with CUPPAD to be our Designated Planning Agency, executed a six county interlocal agreement, and coordinated appointments to the MMP Committee

Emergency Management: Supported damage assessment process review, plan updates, training site identification

Local Support: Assisted county operations, municipalities, and organizations with maps, data, and letters of support including Republic, Forsyth, Ishpeming C, MDOT, MCRC, Forsyth Forward, NMU, Partridge Creek Farm, Superior Watershed Partnership, and the Lions Club

Strategic Plan: Managed implementation of the Plan including development of the Intranet

2. Community Development

The Division manages a Housing Repairs Programs and assists other housing-related initiatives in the County



Activities

Attainable housing regional collaboration:

Facilitated monthly Housing Coalition meetings, participant on the Intergovernmental Housing Task Force, and a member of the newly formed Housing Now Steering Committee

Lead Supervisor Contractor Training:

Assisted to set up one DHHS sponsored Lead Supervisor training and set up a second training for January 2025 to build the qualified contractor pool for CDBG funded projects

Brownfield & Land Bank Authorities:

Attended regular meetings and provided support for numerous grant and program implementation including Target Market Analysis review

Rural Land Bank Network Learning Exchange:

Successfully applied to send a delegation of four to join other rural land banks in Charleston, WV and the Reclaiming Vacant Properties Conference in St. Louis, MO

Emergency Repairs Program



Projects included: restoring water and heat, foundation repairs, drain tile, new exterior steps and a well installation

In 2024, the Division applied for and acquired a \$500,000 grant- the Michigan State Housing & Development Authority (MSHDA) Community Development Block Grant Housing Improving Local Livability (CHILL)

3. Forestry

The Division manages the County Forest under the direction of the Forestry Commission



Activities

- Finalized the Forest Management Plan, adopted 2.7.24
- Hired American Forest Management (AFM) as the 2024-2025 Consulting Forester
- Administered two active harvests: 1-22 Sale [125 acres] & 1-24 Sale [113 acres]
- Reforestation- natural regeneration [177.5 acres]
- Conducted a Fire Break Analysis
- Illegal Dumping: 8 site clean ups
- Reviewed multiple easement & conveyance requests
- Coordinated with the NMU Conservation Data Lab to conduct a vegetation assessment of the central UP

4. Recreation

The Division coordinates regionally on recreation-related activities and manages county-owned recreation facilities

Recreation Coordination

Trails Sustainability Coalition: As a steering committee member, guided the public outreach and development of the *Greater Marquette Region Strategic Trails Plan* and continue to collaborate on implementation

Sustainable Outdoor Recreation Tourism
Management: Collaborated with the BB
Stewardship Council on annual festivals,
programming, and a resident sentiment survey

Recreation Planning: Engaged with the community through meetings and a survey to update the County's Recreation Plan. Reviewed multiple municipal plans for consistency

Donation System: Implemented a QR donation system so visitors can easily donate to the upkeep and maintenance of recreation sites

Big Bay Harbor: Attended the MI Harbormaster Summit and coordinated with the US Army Corps of Engineers about sediment build-up and need for a redesign of the Harbor break wall

Respect Marquette County Coalition: As a partner, collaborated on outdoor tourism messaging and data to inspire respect of local culture and natural resources. Hosted and presented to partners about county recreation projects in KI Sawyer

Sugarloaf Mt. Natural Area Enhancements: Completed a MDARD grant (\$85k) to prioritize critical safety projects. Coordinated with GLCC and MARESA for trail improvements, erosion control, and structure repair

Little Trout Lake Park Enhancements:

Acquired a \$1M DNR Spark grant, developed construction plans, researched past use, hosted community engagement, and removed multiple blighted structures in coordination with the Land Bank

- Developed an application for an EPA Community Change Grant with partners including but not limited to: LSCP, Community Foundation, Mqt. Co. Road Commission, & Forsyth Township
- Continuous communication with project partners
